Paul Revere	propagandist. Boston Massacre / Revere's Ride	Engraving of the "Bleeding Massacre" was caught during his ride
Ethan Allen	Lt. in the army; led the "Green Mountain Boys"; dragged cannons from Ticonderoga to Boston Heights	Ticonderoga - Boston Heights
George Washington	General of the Continental Army	New York, lost Valley Forge, survived   Delaware, win Yorktown, win
Benedict Arnold	Wins at Monmouth Valley. <del>MAA</del> west point to Britain.	
Thomas Jefferson	Writer of the Declaration of Independence, <del>MAA</del>	Declaration of Independence

King Louis XVI	King of France. Brings aid, funding, Army + Navy to help the Patriots.	1st person to recognize American Independence.
Marquis de Lafayette	French Noble who helped fund + clothe his own American troops	
Baron Von Steuben	Prussian officer who taught the Americans Battle Tactics + how to use the bayonet	Valley Forge
John Paul Jones	Naval officer best known for taking the Serapis	"I have not yet begun to fight."
Horatio Gates	American General, tries to overthrow Washington, fails / removed by Congress	
Lord Cornwallis	British General, will lose the Revolutionary war	Yorktown; loses
Francis Marion	American Lt; known as the "Swamp Fox"	uses guerrilla warfare
"Molly Pitcher"	Females who gave water to troops	
Abigail Adams	Shows a non traditional role by going to war John Adams' wife; known as a leader of the Daughters of Liberty; wanted women to have the right to vote
